

2020 President's Member-Guest

Friday, July 24 - Saturday, July 25

Format:

- Two-Day Team Play. Format played will be best ball one of two, net (**both player's scores count on holes 17 and 18**). 100% handicaps.
- The event will consist of Eight (8), ten-team, flights determined by total team handicap index.
- July 17, 2020 handicaps will be used for the tournament to set the field and flights.
- Tees
 - The 1st flight will compete from the **Black** Tees
 - The 2^{nd} & 3^{rd} flight will compete from the **Blue** Tees
 - All other flights will compete from the White Tees
 - Players whose age plus handicap index equals greater than 90 have the option to move up to the green tees. (Flights 4-10 only)
- Each team will play 36 holes over the course of two days:
 - Friday will consist of 18-holes.
 - Saturday will consist of 18-holes.
 - Second round pairings will be based off previous round results (FILO or first-in, last-out).
- In the event of a tie for 1st place in the flight, the USGA method will be used to break the tie.
 All other ties after will split winnings.
- Top 3 places in each flight will be awarded Golf Shop credit.
- Contests
 - Optional team game, \$100 buy in per team (cash). Pay out awarded to top 3 in each flight.
 - Optional skins game, \$100 buy in per team (weekend skins)
 - Closest to the hole contests
- Ground Under Repair will be indicated by white painted circles. If the player's ball lies in the area, or if it interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the player must take relief under rule 25-1.
- Rain
 - In the event of rain or inclement weather, all teams in the flight must have the same number of rounds completed.
 - If play is stopped due to weather or darkness please mark the ball with tees so that the position of your ball can be easily duplicated.
- The "Committee" consists of PGA Director of Golf, Jeff May, PGA Head Professional, Brian Moskevich, Golf Committee and Chair Dan Monfried. All decisions made by the "Committee" are final.
